We are very proud and privileged to announce that 12 of our former foster youth graduated in the past year.

- 7 students are University Graduates, with 3 of them entering graduate programs.
- 2 students graduated from Community College and transferred into Universities.
- 1 student earned her high school diploma and will start community college in the fall
- 1 student completed his welding certification program
- 1 student earned her Master Degree in Public Administration.

This is an amazing accomplishment, which we celebrated at Lake Avenue Church in Pasadena on July 9th. More than 50 program participants and guests attended the graduation event. The 12 graduates were invited to the stage to say a few words about their huge accomplishments. Their speeches were heartfelt and reminded us of the importance of the work and dedication that it takes to accomplish such a significant goal.

Graduation is an amazing accomplishment for these

young adults. Statistically, less than 50% of foster youth graduate high school. Only 10% attend college and less than 3% graduate from college. With support from the team at Journey House, each of these students showed the strength to beat the odds and complete their education.

The team at Journey House is incredibly proud of each and every one of these graduates. Some received financial assistance from Journey House for tuition, book purchases, rental assistance, and other expenses to cover the costs of attending college. More importantly, they all receive emotional support and were able to find a sense of family and belonging at Journey House. They call and vent about their frustrations with teachers and assignments, roommates, and relationships. They come to Journey House because they find comfort and sense of home that most have never had.

We are proud to be a part of the lives of each of these graduates. With your continued support, we will be able to help many more former foster youth complete their education and make a successful transition to being a productive and valuable members of the community.
